## **EWRRC Finances**

Flat Revenues, Increasing Expenses

## County Funding of the EWRRC: Revenue

- From the day the EWRRC opened to 2018, the County provided \$95,700 to support the operating costs of the facility.
- Since 2018, that figure has been \$105,412
- In addition, Opportunity Council puts \$21,000 into the Facilities Fund for maintenance/repairs by means of rent paid on behalf of the federal Head Start's two pre-school classrooms
- Other rental income has always been modest (generally less than \$10K) and during the pandemic, non-existent. About \$4K so far in '22.
- Using the \$10K figure, provided operating revenues generally total \$136,412

## County Funding of the EWRRC: Expenses

Beyond staffing, the EWRRC's primary costs in 2022 are:

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Maintenance and repairs, including various maintenance contracts $ 59,724
Utilities $ 36,951

## Staffing remains modest

- In the beginning, two part-time staff operated the building/limited offerings
- Over the years, some VISTA or other Americorps help and volunteers have assisted
- Today we have a total of 2.0 FTE spread across three to four staff persons
- Total staffing cost, incl. benefits, employer taxes and retirement contribution \$123,031
- Total Operating budget 2022
